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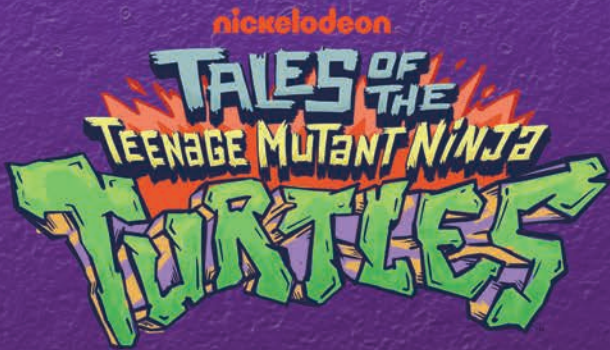

***A Sparrow's Song* - Tobias Eckerlin**

Inspired by a true story, a widowed air raid warden in the midst of World War II struggles to overcome grief and rediscover joy in her life—until she finds a dying sparrow she hopes to save.



***Acrobats* - Eloïse Alluyn, Hugo Danet, Anna Despinoy, Antonin Guerci, Alexandre Marzin, Shali Reddy**

A girl comes back home to an oppressive living room and throws up acrobats in front of her family.



***Jour de vent* - Martin Chailloux, Ai Kim Crespin, Elise Golfouse, Chloé Lab, Hugo Taillez, Camille Truding**

All six of us were students in the same class at ENSI. We wanted to tell a story that was both universal and personal: each member of the team was able to participate and contribute to the film with a little piece of their own story. We created a story that represents each and every one of us, but one that also touches as many people as possible, speaking of family, love, death, work and so on. To ensure that the film speaks to everyone, we created a multitude of characters, all different.



***The Undying Pain of Existence* - Oscar Jacobson, Franz Rügammer, Nadiia Yunatska**

A nude model is posing with statuesque stillness for an elite drawing class—until an unfortunate mosquito bite challenges his self-control. Driven to madness by the itch, he's caught between the ruthless demand for perfection and his most unhinged, animalistic impulses.



***TRASH* - Maxime Crançon, Alexis Le Ral, Robin Delaporte, Romain Fleischer, Mattéo Durand**

Trash is a six-minute animated short with a deconstructed visual style, following the frantic chase of a rat and a pigeon through the alleys and crumbling buildings of a decaying city. Created over a year and a half by eight students from ESMA Lyon, Trash is a modern fable about the excesses of humanity. The film questions human hubris while also leaving room for hope and beauty—even in the midst of chaos.

BEST ANIMATED SHORT SUBJECT



Cardboard - Locksmith Animation

Ovary-Acting - Klipp og Lim, Jante Films, Apparat Filmproduktion AB

Surrounded by babies at her sister's baby shower, Eva fends off endless questions about when she'll be starting a family of her own. Overwhelmed, Eva is struck by a searing stomach pain and rushes to the bathroom, where she unexpectedly gives birth to Ovy, her baby-loving reproductive organs. Mortified, Eva tries to run away, but Ovy chases her through town, determined to convince her they should have a baby. Eva pushes back, and gradually they wear each other down and begin to listen. As they finally see eye to eye, Eva finds the courage to speak her truth.



Pillowzzz - Animoshe

The film unfolds the story of Terry, a clumsy and violent troll, haunted by his past and looking for redemption for his soul. Soft and lovable dwarves, whom he treats rudely, require him to change his attitude, and they win a revolutionary but controversial rescue operation.



Snow Bear - The Art of Aaron Blaise

When a lonely polar bear can't find a friend... he makes one. Set in a rapidly changing world, Snow Bear tells the story of a polar bear in an unforgiving environment on his quest to find a friend. This independently produced 2D hand-drawn film was painstakingly created entirely by Aaron Blaise over three years. With Aaron's lifelong dedication to studying, drawing and animating animals, the adventure is infused with humor, relatability and emotional depth in the tradition of classic animated films. The film was animated and directed by Aaron Blaise. It was produced by Nicholas Burch.

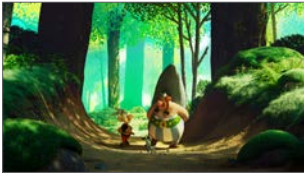


The Girl Who Cried Pearls - National Film Board of Canada

***Asterix & Obelix: The Big Fight, Episode II* - Netflix / Montmartre Films / TAT productions - Aurélien Prédal**

Aurélien Prédal is a French production designer, concept artist and character designer with nearly 20 years of international experience. Graduating from Gobelins in 2006 with the short *Burning Safari*, he designed key productions like *Mune: Guardian of the Moon* and *Ron's Gone Wrong*, earning an Annie Award nomination. He has collaborated with studios like Aardman, Pixar, Sony Pictures Animation, DreamWorks, Laika, Illumination and Locksmith Animation on projects including *Spider-Man: Across the Spider-Verse*, *Inside Out 2*, *Chicken Run: Dawn of the Nugget* and *Asterix & Obelix: The Big Fight*. Based in London, he is recognized as a world-class visual development artist.



***Forevergreen, Special Production* - Nathan Engelhardt and Jeremy Spears - Jeremy Spears, Gregory Culp**

Jeremy Spears is an Annie Award-winning story artist helping create beloved characters and stories for films such as *Zootopia 2*, *Encanto*, *Wreck-It Ralph* and *Frozen*. When not working, he loves adventuring with his family and designing and woodcarving in his Whittle Woodshop. Greg Culp graduated from the University of Waterloo in 2006 with a degree in Fine Arts. He now lives in Burbank, California with his wife Andrea and three daughters. Since 2012, Greg has worked at Disney Animation Studios in Cinematography Lighting. In his free time, Greg enjoys plein-air digital painting and sketching, photography, and taking the family to Disneyland or to Malibu for a beach day..



***Love, Death + Robots, Episode: How Zeke Got Religion* - Blur Studio for Netflix - Gigi Cavenago**

Gigi Cavenago is an Italian comic book artist, illustrator, concept artist and art director. After studying at the Scuola del Fumetto and Istituto Rizzoli, he made his publishing debut in 2005 and has since worked on various comic book anthologies and series, including *Dylan Dog*, *Tales of Tomorrow* and *The Magic Order*. He ventured into animation in 2023 as art director on *Love, Death + Robots* 'How Zeke Got Religion,' winning an Emmy in production design. He is currently working as a character designer on *Mister Miracle* and as a visual artist on *Spider-Man: Beyond the Spider-Verse* for Sony Animation.



***ParaNorman: The Thrifting, Special Production* - LAIKA - Thibault Leclercq, Santiago Montiel, Jung Woonyoung, Stephanie Bray-Lee**

ParaNorman: The Thrifting's production design artists, Thibault Leclercq, Stephanie Bray-Lee, Santiago Montiel and Jung Woonyoung, are part of Laika's core visual development team. They share a variety of animation experience including work on Laika's upcoming feature *Wildwood* and contribute on various projects in development. Their approach to design on *ParaNorman: The Thrifting* was rooted in a stylized combination of the original animated film *ParaNorman* mixed with various vintage horror film artwork to bring this new CG short film to life.



***Wednesdays with Gramps, Short Film* - DreamWorks Animation - Frederic Stewart**

Frederic Stewart is an illustrator, visual development artist, and art director currently working at DreamWorks Feature Animation. A graduate of San Jose State University, he is a fifteen-year veteran of the entertainment industry.

PRODUCTION DESIGN IN AN ANIMATED FEATURE PRODUCTION



***Elio* - Pixar Animation Studios - Harley Jessup, Ernesto Nemesio, Maria Lee, Kristian Norelius, Kyle Jones**

Production designer Harley Jessup (*Monsters, Inc.*, *Ratatouille*, *Coco*) led a talented team of art directors—Maria Lee (shading design), Kristian Norelius (set design), Ernesto Nemesio (lighting design) and Kyle Jones (graphic design)—imagining the world of *Elio*. Employing new technology, there were few limits to the visual storytelling. In contrast to the earth-bound hard edges of the military base, the *Elio* design team created a dazzling version of outer space, vast in scale but actually inspired by natural microscopic structures. The project, spanning four years of development and production, opens our hearts to an inspiring vision of the universe.



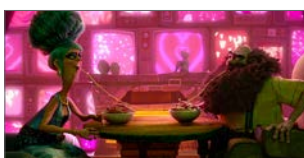
***KPop Demon Hunters* - Sony Pictures Animation for Netflix - Helen Chen, Dave Bleich, Wendell Dalit, Scott Watanabe, Celine Kim**

Led by production designers Mingjue Helen Chen and Dave Bleich and art directors Celine DaHyeu Kim, Scott Watanabe and Wendell Dalit, the *KPop Demon Hunters* production design team built a visually arresting world grounded in Korean heritage and pop spectacle. Their work seamlessly integrates stylized character aesthetics, mythological symbolism and contemporary Seoul cityscapes—delivering a cohesive design language that bridges magical realism with genre-defying action. From concept to final frame, the team established a bold visual identity central to the film's storytelling.



***The Bad Guys 2* - DreamWorks Animation - Luc Desmarchelier, Floriane Marchix**

Production designer Luc Desmarchelier joined DreamWorks Animation to work on *The Prince of Egypt* and went on to work on *The Road to El Dorado* and *Shrek*. He won an Annie Award for his work on *Spirit: Stallion of the Cimarron*. Previous credits of art director Floriane Marchix include *Penguins of Madagascar*, *How to Train Your Dragon: The Hidden World* and *Abominable*. *The Bad Guys 2* has also been recognized by the Art Directors Guild with a nomination for excellence in production design.



***The Twits* - Netflix Presents / The Roald Dahl Story Company - Estefania Pantoja, Alexandre Diboine, Clement Dartigues, Fernando Peque, Remi Salmon**

In look, tone and theme, *The Twits* is an unconventional animated film. The film's design language is that of a child: draw outside the lines, add scribbles as details and stop when you are bored. Hand-drawn, broken and perfect live together in *The Twits*. The team pushed themselves and the CG tools beyond the norm. The shapes may not be realistic but the realism comes from a feeling that this place is actually lived in. Coupled with natural lighting, the design team balances the visuals of warm and hopeful (the kids) and weird and kind of gross (the Twits).



***Zootopia 2* - Walt Disney Animation Studios - Cory Loftis, Limei Z. Hshieh**

Production designer Cory Loftis, art director of environments Limei Hshieh and the *Zootopia 2* visual development department expanded the animal metropolis to include new environments for reptiles and pinnipeds—imagining new parts of Zootopia that were not seen in the first film, like Marsh Market. A neighborhood of semiaquatic mammals was a fun and exciting design challenge—a bustling, living habitat where creatures like sea lions are able to move about easily with lots of slides, ramps and tubes.



BEST SPECIAL PRODUCTION



***A Loud House Christmas Movie: Naughty or Nice* – Nickelodeon Animation Studio & Jam Filled Entertainment**

In *A Loud House Christmas Movie: Naughty or Nice*, Lincoln discovers that he is on Santa's Naughty List. Convinced it's a mistake, he hacks into the North Pole's computer but accidentally switches the entire Naughty and Nice list, which ends up turning Santa evil! With his family's help, Lincoln must venture to the North Pole to save Christmas. Along the way, he learns something about the kind of kid he truly is.



***Adult Swim's The Elephant* – Titmouse and Williams Street**

Adult Swim's The Elephant is a rare creative experiment in which each of the three acts is made in isolation. With Sugar and Jones-Quartey working as a duo and McHale and Ward overseeing their own separate parts, the special is guided by "game masters" and *Adventure Time* alums Jack Pendarvis and Kent Osborne for a storytelling experiment that unfolds as a collaborative surprise, ultimately merging into a single, unexpected narrative.



***Not Just a Goof* – Venturia Animation Studios® for CNEK Films LLC**

Not Just a Goof features hand-drawn sequences that capture the spirit behind the making of the 1995 cult classic *A Goofy Movie*, a film now widely embraced by a generation of millennials. The documentary reflects on its long-term cultural impact through archival material and original animation created by Venturia Animation Studios®, bringing to life the challenges, creativity and legacy of a Disney classic. The animated reenactments place the real-life crew inside the "Goofyverse," portraying them with iconic dog-like noses and embracing a rough blue-pencil aesthetic that honors the craft of 1990s traditional animation.



***Snoopy Presents: A Summer Musical* – WildBrain Studios in association with Apple TV**

Snoopy Presents: A Summer Musical is a musical special about the joy and magic of summer camp and the importance of preserving what you love. Charlie Brown loves camp and is determined to make his final year special, but Sally, a first-time camper, is nervous and skeptical of the new and unfamiliar place. While everyone settles into camp, Snoopy and Woodstock discover a treasure map that takes them on a wild adventure nearby.



***The Night Before Christmas in Wonderland* – Lupus Films, Universal Pictures Content Group**

St. Nick receives a delayed letter on Christmas Eve from the Princess of Hearts. He and his dedicated team of reindeer set off to Wonderland where they're greeted by the mean and miserable Queen of Hearts who hates all things Christmas... especially presents! Can St. Nick, aided by Alice, the Mad Hatter and March Hare, show the Queen the true meaning of Christmas and save the day before it's too late?

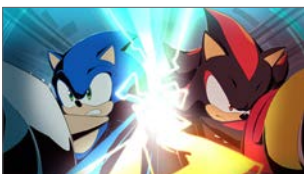
LouiMax Dreams of Being An Adult - Imagine Create Media Inc. in conjunction with Maileg APS

The film was written by Maileg's founder, Dorthe Mailil, and is voiced by Andy Serkis. The film follows LouiMax, a curious little mouse who can't wait to grow up. He imagines that being an adult means flying airplanes, staying up late and doing whatever he wants, whenever he wants. But when LouiMax magically wakes up all grown-up, he discovers that childhood has its own magic.



Olipop Yeti - Screen Novelties & Passion Pictures

Significant and benevolent or charitable impact on the art and industry of animation.



SANDRA RABINS

Sandy Rabins helped build the animation division of DreamWorks Studios from the ground up and was instrumental in the acquisition of Pacific Data Images (PDI), helping grow it into a theatrical digital-effects powerhouse. She produced DreamWorks' first traditionally animated feature, *The Prince of Egypt*, and the computer-animated *Antz*, the first feature from PDI/DreamWorks.

In 2001, Rabins served as an executive producer on the blockbuster comedy *Shrek*, which won the People's Choice Award for Best Comedy Feature and the first Academy Award for Best Animated Feature.

Rabins then moved to Sony Pictures Animation, serving as Senior Executive Vice President from 2002 to 2009. There, she worked on the hit comedy *Open Season*, the critically acclaimed *Surf's Up*, *Cloudy with a Chance of Meatballs*, and *Hotel Transylvania*.

Rabins and her producing partner, Penney Finkelman Cox, co-own the independent live-action production company Patchwork Productions, which executive-produced the 2007 feature film *Snakes on a Plane*.

In 2010, at DreamWorks Animation Television, she served as a senior executive producer overseeing *Dragons: Riders of Berk*, a series based on the worldwide hit film *How to Train Your Dragon*. The series won four Annie Awards, including Best Animated TV Production for Children in 2013.

With Kathryn Bigelow, she produced the 2016 award-winning short *Last Days of Ivory*. In 2015, she built Original Force's animation division, producing the company's first animated film, *Duck, Duck, Goose*.

More recently, she produced Paramount Pictures' 2024 film *The Tiger's Apprentice* and has taught at USC, BYU, NYU, and Escena, a school of animation located in Mexico City.

Rabins is a member of the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences, as well as the Producers Guild of America (PGA) and ASIFA-Hollywood.

For many years, Sandy Rabins has been a profound force in the animation industry. Then, during the 2025 Eaton and Palisades Fires, she used her vast experience to quickly rally ASIFA-Hollywood and created AnimAID to assist and support colleagues affected by the fires. For this monumental effort, she is receiving the 53rd Annies June Foray Award.

WILL RYAN EXCELLENCE IN HUMOR AWARD

The Will Ryan Excellence in Humor Award is an animation industry award that encourages and recognizes emerging, talented individuals for their contributions to further the innovative future of animation with an emphasis on humor. New talent is not based upon the age or experience of the recipient, but rather new or innovative contributions to the animation industry as a whole. This includes all genres and approaches in the vast realm that might fall within the area of animation.

ABOUT WILL RYAN

Always recognizable by his signature cowboy hat, Will Ryan was a humorist, author, creator, animator, scriptwriter, producer, actor, voice actor, singer, composer, musician, and past president of ASIFA-Hollywood, with more than 50 film and television credits to his name. His talents and contributions far exceeded his too-short lifetime, and he remains a well-known and deeply respected member of the animation community.



As a voice actor, Will brought to life beloved characters including Rabbit and Tigger, Goofy and Donald Duck, Willie the Giant and Pete in Mickey's Christmas Carol, among countless others for Disney, Warner Bros, Amblin, Sullivan Bluth, Harper & Row and more. He also wrote and recorded numerous songs for Disney films and television projects. In 1997, Will received a prestigious Annie Award nomination for Best Song in an Animated Production: Elmo Aardvark, Outer Space Detective! The Elmo Aardvark Song.

A committed artist and generous philanthropist, Will believed strongly in "paying it forward." Together with his wife, Nancy, he established the Will Ryan Trust. Working in partnership with ASIFA-Hollywood, Nancy continues to honor Will's legacy by supporting his vision of an annual award recognizing innovation and excellence in humorous animation.

MUSIC IN AN ANIMATED TELEVISION/MEDIA PRODUCTION



***Common Side Effects, Episode: Lakeshore Limited* – Green Street Pictures, Bandera Entertainment, and Williams Street Productions – Nicolas Snyder**

Nicolas Snyder is a composer and sound artist based in Los Angeles. He artfully arranges currents of organic texture, field recordings, digital manipulations and found sound that converges into something simultaneously primitive and elegant. Snyder's compositions are intricate studies that swirl with unpredictability and timbral invention. His work in film and TV includes HBO Max's critically acclaimed animated series *Common Side Effects* and *Scavengers Reign*, the Oscar-nominated short film *Beautiful Men*, Netflix's globe-trotting food series *Ugly Delicious*, several Vimeo Staff Picks, as well as many commercials such as FedEx's *Dreams* directed by Michel Gondry.



***Devil May Cry, Episode: The First Circle* – A Netflix Series / Studio Mir / Adi Shankar Animation / Capcom – Power Glove, Alex Seaver, Tyler Demorest**

Developed under creator/executive producer Adi Shankar's creative direction, *Devil May Cry's* music team blends cinematic world-building with unforgettable sound. At the musical forefront is Mako (Alexander Seaver), an American composer/producer and DJ whose credits include genre-spanning work from EDM hits to Emmy-nominated scores for *Arcane*. Tyler Demorest is a Los Angeles-based songwriter and producer who contributed dynamic scoring across *Devil May Cry*. Joining them are series composers Power Glove (Jarome and Joel Harmsworth), the Australian synthwave duo known for their critically acclaimed work on Ubisoft's *Far Cry 3: Blood Dragon*.



***Éiru, Short Film* – Cartoon Saloon – Leo Pearson, Ceara Conway**

When the water disappears from the well in a warrior clan's village, an intrepid child descends into the belly of the earth to retrieve it. *Éiru* was produced by Cartoon Saloon, directed by Giovanna Ferrari, in association with Herstory, Screen Ireland and BCP. Leo Pearson is a composer and music producer. He has worked with U2, Disney+ and recently composed the score for *Star Wars: Visions* volume 2 short 'Screecher's Reach.' Leo composed the score of *Éiru* and co-composed the song 'Amhrán Éiru' with Ceara Conway. Ceara Conway is an artist who works across music, song, texts and visual art.



***Snoopy Presents: A Summer Musical, Special Production* – WildBrain Studios in association with Apple TV – Ben Folds, Jeff Morrow, Alan Zachary, Michael Weiner**

Snoopy Presents: A Summer Musical is a musical special about the joy and magic of summer camp and the importance of preserving what you love. Charlie Brown loves camp and is determined to make his final year special, but Sally, a first-time camper, is nervous and skeptical of the new and unfamiliar place. While everyone settles into camp, Snoopy and Woodstock discover a treasure map that takes them on a wild adventure nearby.



***Win Or Lose, Episodes: Episode 6, Mixed Signals* – Pixar Animation Studios – Ramin Djawadi, Shane Eli, Johnny Pakfar**

Ramin Djawadi has created some of the most memorable themes in media such as scores for *Game of Thrones*, *Westworld*, *3 Body Problem*, *Eternals*, *Iron Man*, *Jack Ryan* and *A Wrinkle in Time*. Versatility has defined Djawadi's career. Shane Eli and Jonny Pakfar, known professionally as Campfire, are multi-platinum, award-winning composers, writers and producers. Renowned for their innovative approach to blending traditional film scoring with modern production techniques, they have emerged as sought-after creators in the entertainment industry. Most recently, the duo collaborated with composer Ramin Djawadi on Pixar's first original animated series, *Win or Lose*.

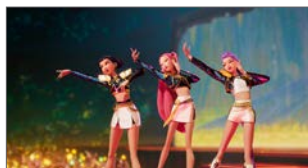
Arco – Remembers, MountainA France, France 3 Cinéma – Arnaud Toulon

Arnaud Toulon is a Paris-based composer specializing in music for picture. His work ranges from fiction films and TV series to documentaries, contemporary dance and arrangements for other artists. Across these projects, he develops a musical style that blends classical influences, electronic textures and sonic experimentation, shaped by his experience in sound design for cinema. Closely connected to the world of animation, he has collaborated with the Paris-based studio Remembers since its founding—an artistic partnership that led to his first feature film, *Arco*, directed by Ugo Bienvenu and presented this year at the Cannes and Annecy festivals.



Elio – Pixar Animation Studios – Rob Simonsen

Rob Simonsen is a composer and solo artist, known for blending analog synthesis and processed textures with orchestral color and poignant melodies, crafting scores that feel both intimate and expansive. His recent work also includes Darren Aronofsky's Oscar-nominated *The Whale*—recognized by the Hollywood Music in Media Awards, the Society of Composers & Lyricists and the Indiana Film Journalists Association—and Marvel Studios' *Deadpool & Wolverine*, an HMMA sci-fi/fantasy nominee. Earlier, Simonsen's twin coming-of-age scores for *The Spectacular Now* and *The Way Way Back* earned a World Soundtrack Award "Discovery of the Year" nomination.



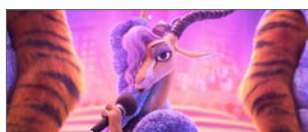
KPop Demon Hunters – Sony Pictures Animation for Netflix – KPop Demon Hunters Music Team

Music is in the DNA of *KPop Demon Hunters*. The team behind the music, including executive music producer Ian Eisendrath and composer Marcelo Zarvos, shaped the film's dynamic sonic identity by merging K-pop sensibilities with cinematic scoring. In collaboration with powerhouse producers TheBlackLabel and vocalists EJAE, Rei Ami and Audrey Nuna—the powerhouse voices behind the fictional girl group HUNTR/X—the team crafted original songs and arrangements that propel character arcs, elevate choreography and deepen emotional resonance. The result is a cohesive, genre-blending score that grounds the narrative and amplifies its global pop appeal.



Little Amélie or the Character of Rain – Maybe Movies, Ikki Films, Distributed by GKIDS – Mari Fukuhara

Mari Fukuhara creates romantic music as if she were painting a landscape. Her piano touch and string arrangements reflect her background in classical music. Mari also works with synthesizers, samplers and other electronic instruments. Based in Tokyo, she graduated from the Toho Gakuen School of Music. She began her career as a member of the bands Shi-Shonen and Real Fish, Ten, Fishermen Tit Tot. As a solo artist, she performs, produces songs, supports live shows and composes music for numerous films and videos. After composing the music for *Little Amélie's* pilot in 2021, she returned to score the full-length feature.



Zootopia 2 – Walt Disney Animation Studios – Shakira, Ed Sheeran, Blake Slatkin, Michael Giacchino

The *Zootopia 2* score is composed by Academy Award winner Michael Giacchino, and the all-new original song, "Zoo," was written by Ed Sheeran, Blake Slatkin and Shakira. The song is produced by Blake Slatkin, Alex (A.C.) Castillo, Shakira and Ed Sheeran. A celebration of *Zootopia* itself, and what the animal metropolis stands for, the song also has Judy and Nick's relationship at its core. The film's score is a blend of genres and styles, growing bigger with a greater musical variety for this expansion of the *Zootopia* story.

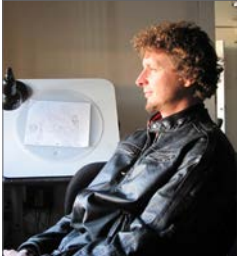
***Asterix & Obelix: The Big Fight, Episode IV* - Netflix / Montmartre Films / TAT Productions - Borja Montoro**

Borja Montoro, Madrid-born animator/character designer, boasts 35-plus years in animation. After studying law but pursuing art, he started in 1988 as a 2D animator in Madrid, then spent seven years (1995-2002) at Disney France on *Hercules*, *Tarzan* (with Glen Keane), *The Emperor's New Groove* and others. Back in Madrid since 2003, he's mainly worked as a character designer on shows like Netflix's *Asterix & Obelix: The Big Fight*, Disney's *Zootopia*, *Moana*, *Ralph Breaks the Internet*, DreamWorks' *The Boss Baby* and *Wild Robot*, Illumination's *Despicable Me 3* and Angel Studio's *David*. He now directs at U-TAD and leads masterclasses worldwide.



***Bat-Fam, Episode: A Knight at the Movies* - Amazon MGM Studios, Warner Bros. Animation, DC Entertainment - Benjamin Tong**

Benjamin Tong began in November 2017 as a character designer on *Where's Waldo?* and *Archibald's Next Big Thing* at DreamWorks TV. Later on he continued doing development work at Disney TVA before getting on *Merry Little Batman* and then afterward on *Bat-Fam* at Warner Brothers Animation. As character design lead, Ben specializes in collaborating with the show's directors and guiding other character designers in designing some of the characters from the ground up, special poses, expressions and turns. Benjamin grew up in San Gabriel, California, before attending Savannah College of Art and Design. He currently resides in San Gabriel, California.



***Love, Death + Robots, Episode: 400 Boys* - Blur Studio for Netflix - Robert Valley**

Robert Valley is a Canadian animator and director celebrated for his "hyper-graphic" visual style, characterized by sharp angles, deep shadows and exaggerated perspectives. Born in Vancouver and trained at Emily Carr University of Art and Design, Valley's early career included work on *Æon Flux*. He gained international acclaim for designing and directing Gorillaz music videos and lead character designs for Disney's *Tron: Uprising*. His independent short film, *Pear Cider and Cigarettes*, earned a 2017 Academy Award nomination. Most recently, he directed acclaimed episodes for Netflix's *Love, Death & Robots*, including 'Zima Blue,' 'Ice' and '400 Boys.'



***Wednesdays with Gramps, Short Film* - DreamWorks Animation - Seth St. Pierre**

London-based American artist Seth St. Pierre started his career in graphic design while exhibiting his personal work at galleries in Detroit, Los Angeles and Tokyo. After many years, he returned to his first love—animation! In addition to storyboarding for animation studios, he has carved out a reputation as a versatile and original character designer. Seth is a cultural nomad drawn to diverse art styles, languages, techniques and stories. When he's not creating, Seth spends his time searching for the perfect espresso.



***Win Or Lose, Episodes: 8, Home* - Pixar Animation Studios - Lou Hamou-Lhadj**

Lou Hamou-Lhadj joined Pixar in 2007 as a character artist on *WALL-E*. Since then he has worked as a character artist and lead on a number of Pixar films including *Toy Story 3*, *Brave*, *The Good Dinosaur*, *Incredibles 2*, *Onward* and *Turning Red*. More recently, Lou directed the finale episode of Pixar's first-ever original series, *Win or Lose*, where he also served as the character designer across all episodes. Lou grew up in Turnersville, New Jersey, and attended New York University. Lou is currently in development directing an unannounced Pixar project.

Elio's visual development team, led by Bob Pauley, brought to life a rich and imaginative cast of characters that inhabit the film's expansive universe. The team included Matt Nolte, Yingzong Xin, James Woods and Kaleb Rice, whose collective work shaped the visual identity, personality and emotional appeal of the film's characters. Blending artistry with innovation, the character design team explored a wide range of forms, textures and silhouettes to support the story's themes of connection, wonder and belonging. From grounded human designs to inventive extraterrestrial characters, the designs balance clarity of performance with visual invention.



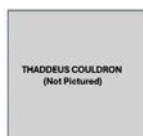
Fixed – Sony Pictures Animation for Netflix – Craig Kellman

Craig Kellman is an acclaimed character designer and production designer known for his bold, stylized work across animation and feature film. As production designer on *Fixed*, Kellman brought his signature flair for expressive design and heightened visual comedy to the film. A veteran of the industry, his credits include character design for *Madagascar*, *Hotel Transylvania*, *The Powerpuff Girls*, *Cloudy with a Chance of Meatballs 2* and *Trolls*. With a distinctive aesthetic that pushes form and exaggeration, Kellman is celebrated for creating instantly iconic characters that resonate across genres and audiences.



KPop Demon Hunters – Sony Pictures Animation for Netflix – Scott Watanabe, Ami Thompson

Character designer Ami Thompson and character art director Scott Watanabe played a pivotal role in defining the stylized, emotionally expressive look of *KPop Demon Hunters*. Drawing from anime, manhwa and K-pop aesthetics, their collaborative work shaped the film's bold silhouettes, iconic costumes and dynamic facial design. Watanabe led the development of distinct visual languages for each character, while Thompson infused them with personality-driven detail—from weapon etchings to chibi-inspired exaggeration. Together, they balanced fashion-forward appeal with narrative clarity, creating characters that are as visually memorable as they are emotionally resonant.



The SpongeBob Movie: Search for SquarePants – Paramount Animation / Nickelodeon Movies – Adam Paloian, Thaddeus Couldron, Alvi Ramirez

The SpongeBob Movie: Search for SquarePants is a swashbuckling seafaring comedy-adventure that takes us to the deepest depths of the deep sea where no sponge has gone before—an all-new spooky, surreal world filled with new characters and surprises. Adam Paloian (lead character designer) is an Emmy Award-winning director best known for his work on *SpongeBob SquarePants* and *The Cuphead Show!* Alvi Ramirez (visual development) has worked on both series and films, including *Robot Dreams* and *My Little Pony: A New Generation*. Thaddeus Couldron (visual development) credits include *SpongeBob SquarePants*, *Uncle Grandpa* and *The SpongeBob SquarePants Movie*.



The Twits – Netflix Presents / The Roald Dahl Story Company – Kei Acedera, Tristan Poulain, Jules Rigolle, Fernando Peque, Remi Salmon

The Twits' character design team created organic, unconstrained and imperfect characters. Gobelins graduate Remi Salmon began his production design path on the indie film *Mune: Guardian of the Moon*. Kei Acedera, Emmy-winning creator, has worked with directors such as Tim Burton, Jon Chu, Brenda Chapman, Issa Lopez and Peter Ramsey. Brazilian designer Fernando Peque's work ranges from commercials to features, including *Ron's Gone Wrong*. Tristan Poulain has worked with many feature studios, including Laika, Paramount and Warner Bros. Jules Rigolle has been working as a character designer since graduating from Gobelins, winning an Annie Award for his work on *Trollhunters*.

***Bye Sweet Carole* - Little Sewing Machine - Chris Darril**

Chris Darril is an Italian artist, director and screenwriter. Creator of *Bye Sweet Carole* and the *Remothered* series, he's independent by choice, working across films and video games, pioneering transmedia art. Praised by industry luminaries such as Keiichiro Toyama (*Silent Hill*), Jean Luc-Cano (*Life Is Strange*) and Conrad Roset (*Gris*), he has set historic records for his country. Condemning AI, Chris champions traditional craftsmanship, personally handling character design, environment art and more, strongly believing that art is the key to human freedom and the most powerful vehicle of hope and change for a society still plagued by hatred and inequality.



***Death Stranding 2: On the Beach* - Kojima Productions - Hideo Kojima, Masaaki Kawata, Kojima Productions, PlayStation Studios XDEV**

Kojima Productions is a creative studio led by game creator Hideo Kojima. Keeper's world is a mix of strange and familiar, inhabited by creatures that can at times seem alien due to their impossible blend of inanimate objects and organic matter. The world and characters convey the story without words, using only motion, gesture and dreamlike visions to draw its players in. Animation allows unorthodox creatures to come to life and engage the player character and its companions, making the world feel rich and vibrant.

From the creators of *Contrast* and *We Happy Few*, *South of Midnight* is a spellbinding third-person action-adventure game set in the American Deep South. As Hazel, you will explore the mythos and encounter creatures of Southern folklore in a macabre and fantastical world. When disaster strikes her hometown, Hazel is called to become a Weaver: a magical mender of broken bonds and spirits. Imbued with these new abilities, Hazel will confront and subdue dangerous creatures, untangle the webs of her own family's shared past and find her way to a place that feels like home.

***A Minecraft Movie* - Warner Bros. Pictures / Legendary Pictures / Mojang Studios / Vertigo Entertainment / On the Roam, Weta FX - Kevin Estey, Anthony McIndoe, Jade Lorier, Caroline Ting, Luisma Lavin Peredo**

The Wētā FX team honored the iconic block aesthetic from this popular game franchise, adapting it to blend with the live-action performers. Everything from clouds and mountain ranges to creatures, fire, lava and embers followed not only the cube shapes, but also the inherent behaviors from the familiar *Minecraft* world.



***Captain America: Brave New World* - Marvel Studios / Walt Disney Studios Motion Pictures, Weta FX - Sidney Kombo-Kintombo, Andrew William Park, Marco Röth, Paul Seyb, Thien Ly**

Wētā FX turned Harrison Ford into Red Hulk using cutting-edge skin deformation techniques and simulated muscle firing while still allowing artists full control. Physically plausible down to the last pore and sweat drop, the unmistakable presence of Ford was evident in every expression and grimace, even through the blown-out proportions of a red-hot Hulk.



***How To Train Your Dragon* - DreamWorks Animation, Framestore - Kayn Garcia, Jean-Denis Haas, Meena Ibrahim, Nathan McConnell, Nick Tripodi**

Building the dragons of Berk was a huge undertaking. Creating believable connections between performer and dragon relied on puppeteers who gave the cast scene partners, as well as gimbals built by SFX and programmed by Framestore's animation teams to give each dragon flight characteristics that reflected their anatomical design. The Red Death was something else entirely. Due to its enormous size, the film's dragon antagonist was portrayed through individual sets for its mouth and another for its eye, as well as a digital asset.



***Prehistoric Planet: Ice Age* - BBC Studios Natural History Unit in association with Apple TV, Framestore - Adrien Annesley, Alvis Avati, Riyad Chalakkara, Daniel Mizuguchi, Liam Russell**

For *Prehistoric Planet: Ice Age*, Framestore's animation team brought mammalian megafauna to life with the grounded realism of a nature documentary. Eschewing "hero angles" for a restrained, observational style, we utilized handcrafted keyframe animation to capture the biomechanical weight of creatures like the woolly mammoth. Framestore's proprietary FAT (Framestore Anatomy Tool) system simulated complex muscle dynamics, while the true illusion of life lay in the eyes. By focusing on micro-movements and subtle nuances, we imbued creatures like the solitary Gigantopithecus with genuine thought and emotion, ensuring they felt not just scientifically accurate, but truly alive.



***Superman* - DC Studios, Framestore - Loic Mireault, Michael Elder, Philipp Winterstein, Victor Dinis, Diego De Paula Pereira Batista**

For *Superman*, Framestore's animation team faced a unique challenge: turning James Gunn's real-life rescue dog, Ozu, into the Man of Steel's alien companion, Krypto. Utilizing expert keyframe animation, the team translated Ozu's chaotic energy into a grounded, living character. From a 4-million-strand groom battling Antarctic winds to a cape simulated for comic-book perfection, the team balanced high-end physics with genuine heart. It's a performance that sees Krypto steal the show, capturing the chaotic charm of a dog who isn't always a "good boy."

***Asterix & Obelix: The Big Fight, Episode III* - Netflix / Montmartre Films / TAT productions - Floriane Caseiro**

Floriane Caseiro is a character animator who began her career on the TV series *The Jungle Bunch*. She later transitioned to feature animation, contributing to films including *The Jungle Bunch 1 & 2*, *Terra Willy, Pil's Adventures* and *Epic Tails*. She served as character lead and lead animator on *Asterix & Obelix: The Big Fight*, for which she is an Annie Award nominee for character animation—TV/media.



***Forevergreen, Special Production* - Nathan Engelhardt and Jeremy Spears - Brendan Gottlieb**

Brendan Gottlieb grew up in Virginia and discovered his passion for storytelling through animation at an early age. He developed his craft through a bachelor's in film studies at George Mason University and a character animation program at Animation Mentor. He moved to Los Angeles to work at Walt Disney Animation Studios as an animator in 2015, where he worked on award-winning films such as *Moana*, *Encanto*, *Ralph Breaks the Internet*, *Frozen 2* and *Zootopia 2*. Most recently, he was a lead animator for the VES-nominated short *Better Zoogether* and the award-winning animated short film *Forevergreen*.



***Snoopy Presents: A Summer Musical, Special Production* - WildBrain Studios in association with Apple TV, Chris Derochie**

Chris Derochie is a veteran animation director and supervisor with over four decades of experience across hand-drawn animation, digital production and high-end visual effects. Most recently, he served as animation director on *Snoopy Presents: A Summer Musical*, continuing his longstanding contribution to the Peanuts franchise. Chris has directed both entertainment and culturally focused projects, including Indigenous storytelling initiatives such as *Tales of the First People: Spirit Tales*. His filmography includes *A Goofy Movie*, *District 9*, *The Thing*, *Horizon: Zero Dawn* and the *Stargate* franchise. He is also an educator, mentor and accomplished voice actor.



***The Simpsons, Various Episodes* - A Gracie Films Production in Association with 20th Television Animation - Nik Ranieri**

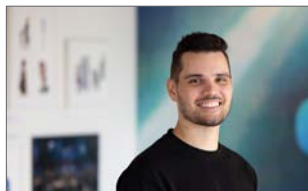
Nik Ranieri was born on Aug. 23, 1961, in Toronto, Canada. At age 9, he discovered his love for drawing cartoons. In his late teens, he enrolled in the animation program at Sheridan College in Oakville, Canada. After graduating in 1984, he began a lengthy career in the animation industry including a 25-year position as a supervising animator at Walt Disney Feature Animation. As of 2017, he has been working on the long-running animated TV series *The Simpsons*. Nik and Jenifer, his wife of 30-plus years, have five children and reside in Orlando, Florida.



***Win Or Lose, Various Episodes* - Pixar Animation Studios - Alli Sadegiani**

Alli Sadegiani is an award-winning Iranian-born Swedish director, animator and animation supervisor. He joined Pixar in 2013 as a character animator after working at Walt Disney Animation and DreamWorks. His credits include *Win or Lose*, *Inside Out*, *Piper*, *Incredibles 2*, *Toy Story 4*, *Soul*, *Luca* and *Tangled*. Alongside his studio work, he makes independent films—his latest award-winning short, *The View*, is a poetic exploration of the human condition, seen through the lens of growing up in 1980s Sweden as the child of immigrant parents.

***Elio* - Pixar Animation Studios - Jonah Sidhom**

Jonah Sidhom joined Pixar Animation Studios in 2022 as an animator. He served as an animator on Disney and Pixar's *Elemental*, *Inside Out 2*, *Elio* and the upcoming feature *Toy Story 5*. As an animator, Sidhom is responsible for crafting the acting and movement of characters, bringing emotional clarity and performance to each scene he works on. Prior to joining Pixar, Sidhom spent six years at Blue Sky Studios from 2015 to 2021, contributing his animation talents to multiple productions. He then joined Walt Disney Animation Studios, where he worked for one year as an animator before moving to Pixar.



***KPop Demon Hunters* - Sony Pictures Animation, Netflix - Ryusuke Furuyai**

Ryusuke Furuya is a character animator at Sony Pictures Imageworks, most recently completing work on the global phenomenon *KPop Demon Hunters*. His work in the film can be seen in some of the iconic fight sequences including the opening airplane fight sequence and bathhouse fight sequence. Ryusuke's Imageworks credits also include the Academy Award-nominated *The Sea Beast*, *Spider-Man: Across the Spider-Verse*, *In Your Dreams* and the upcoming *GOAT*. Prior to Imageworks, Ryusuke worked at a games development company on *Pokémon Shield*, *Pokémon Sword* and *Asura's Wrath*.



***Little Amélie or the Character of Rain* - Maybe Movies, Ikki Films, Distributed by GKIDS - Juliette Laurent**

Born to a film editor father, Juliette quickly developed a passion for cinema. Co-directing her graduation film *In Between* at Gobelins confirmed her interest in character development and story-driven projects. Juliette has worked on several feature films such as *Little Vampire*, *Calamity* and *Little Nicholas*. Before joining the production of *Little Amélie* as lead animator, she worked as a storyboard artist on the upcoming feature film *Asterix: The Kingdom of Nubia* and went on to be an animator and posing supervisor on *Lucy Lost*. Since 2015, she has also been developing webcomic projects by night.



***The Bad Guys 2* - DreamWorks Animation - Ludovic Bouancheau**

Animation supervisor Ludovic Bouancheau has worked on some of the most iconic characters in the DreamWorks Animation library. He received an Annie Award nomination for work on *Kung Fu Panda 3* and a VES Award nomination in 2012 for his character animation work on the titular character of *Puss in Boots*. Additional credits include *The Boss Baby*, *Abominable*, *Trolls World Tour* and *Megamind*.



***Zootopia 2* - Walt Disney Animation Studios - Tony Smeed**

Animator Tony Smeed joined Disney Animation in 1996. His first film with the studio was *Dinosaur*. He went on to supervise the character Abby Mallard on the film *Chicken Little* and was an animator on *Meet the Robinsons*, *Bolt* and *Tangled*. He then returned to a supervising role on the character Vanellope for *Wreck-It Ralph*, Kristoff for *Frozen* and Nick Wilde for the original *Zootopia*—on which he was also co-head of animation. From there, he was head of animation on *Frozen 2* and animation supervisor on *Wish*, in addition to animating on *Encanto*, *Strange World* and *Zootopia 2*.

***Marvel Zombies, Episode 4* – Marvel Animation, Stellar Creative Lab, Inc. – Emma Badia, Tristan Fairclough, Jimmy Dumont, Sheng Hung, Arth Vasavada**

Stellar Creative Lab is an animation studio specializing in high-impact visuals and bold, cinematic storytelling. As the studio behind the animation work on *Marvel Zombies*, the FX nominees Emma Badia, Tristan Fairclough, Jimmy Dumont, Sheng Hung and Arth Vasavada blended handcrafted 2D FX animation with the precision of CG FX simulations to push the boundaries of animated action and horror. This Annie Award nomination for Best FX recognizes a collaborative group of 2D and 3D FX artists driven by craft, innovation and a passion for elevating every frame.



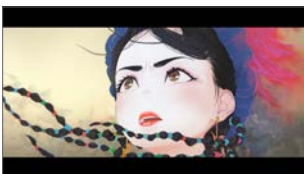
***Prehistoric Planet: Ice Age, Episode: The Big Freeze* – BBC Studios Natural History Unit in association with Apple TV, Framestore – Edward Ferrysienanda, Kevin Christensen, Guy Schuleman, Benedikt Roettger, Kevin Tarpinian**

For *Prehistoric Planet: Ice Age*, Framestore's FX team engineered snow as an active, granular force. Opening with a fully CG mammoth herd, we developed bi-directional simulations where snow accumulation physically weighed down and restricted fur movement. Custom "wind shadowing" logic allowed the herd to authentically shield one another from the blizzard. Proprietary up-res tools injected microscopic detail into drifts and fracturing ice, optimizing simulations to the camera frustum for maximum fidelity. Hexagonal crystal instancing provided the final photoreal glint, ensuring this prehistoric winter felt as biting and tangible as the creatures surviving it.



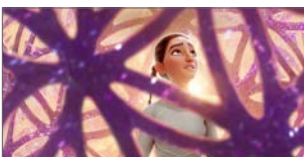
***Spice Frontier, Episode: Escape From Veltegar* – Steamroller Animation, Steamroller Animation – Ben Rische, Tobias Anker, Van Tismo, Thibault Francois, Yung Jie Huang**

Steamroller Animation is an independent, artist-owned studio built on the belief that great animation comes from taking risks. For *Spice Frontier: Escape From Veltegar*, the FX team pushed that philosophy to its limits, designing effects that weren't just visually impressive but creatively executed. Using Unreal Engine as part of our pipeline, we achieved a stylized 2D look through hand-animated multiplane backgrounds, creating depth via layered motion. Characters were designed without traditional lighting or shadows, instead using a custom offset rim-light tool to define silhouettes and separate forms while preserving a flat, graphic aesthetic.



***Star Wars: Visions - Volume 3, Episode: The Bird of Paradise* – Polygon Pictures, Polygon Pictures – Takashi Okamoto, Kohei Yamamoto, Genyo Sasaki, Chizuru Nakamura, Erika Matsui**

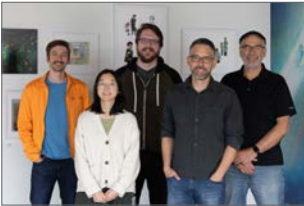

With a combined 17 years at Polygon Pictures, together as a team they contributed their significant talents on projects such as *Stillwater*, *Pacific Rim: The Black*, *Mech Cadets*, *Your Friendly Neighborhood Spider-Man* and many more.



***WONDLA, Episode: Lost* – Skydance Animation in Association with Apple TV, ICON Creative Studio – EP 209 ICON Creative Studio FX Team**

ICON Creative Studio powered the visual effects for *WONDLA*, elevating the series with dynamic, immersive visuals. The Effects team crafted pulse-pounding sequences filled with lasers, destruction, and jaw-dropping explosions—making the finale episode positively *explode* with intensity.

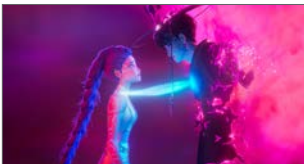

The visual wonder of *Elio* is a testament to world-building through technical artistry, exemplified by the volatile lava pits of Grigon's ship and the intricate holograms of the Communiverse. Ferdi Scheepers, Gary Bruins, Nate Skeen, Shaun Galinak and Alyssa Lee represent a collaborative crew of 27 effects artists that brought this imaginative universe to life over years of development. Their collective work engineered everything from natural fire, water and sand to specialized alien phenomena like Glorp, "clone clay," diplo ship thrusters and bioluminescent drool.



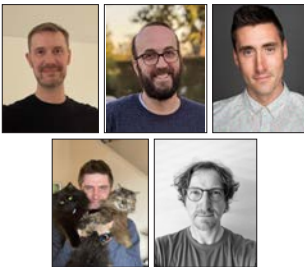
***In Your Dreams* - Netflix, Kuku Studios, Sony Pictures Imageworks - Dmitriy Kolesnik, Stephen Paschke, David Sellares, Stephanie McNair**

The diverse and intricate effects in *In Your Dreams* posed a major artistic and technical challenge for the FX team at Sony Pictures Imageworks. To realize complex simulations—including sand, ocean environments, large-scale destruction and Nightmara's character-driven volumetric effects—the team invested extensive development time exploring a wide range of techniques. Artists collaborated on complex shots, layering dozens of primary and secondary simulations to preserve scale and impact. A unified, nonlinear pipeline across layout, animation, FX, lighting and comp was essential, particularly in balancing Nightmara's movement with her fluid/volumetric form, enabling seamless cross-departmental collaboration to bring these dreams and nightmares to life.



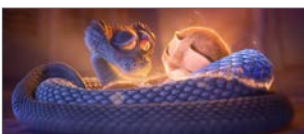
***KPop Demon Hunters* - Sony Pictures Animation for Netflix, Sony Pictures Imageworks - Filippo Maccari, Nicola Finizio, Simon Corboux, Naoki Kato, Daniel La Chapelle**

To achieve the anime-inspired stylized look of *KPop Demon Hunters*, the FX team used a hybrid 2D+3D approach for a lot of the FX simulations. 2D hand-drawn FX allowed us to create art-directed, very specific stylized shapes and movement. Based on that, 3D FX are simulated and carefully integrated with the 2D elements. The scope and complexity of FX in *KPop Demon Hunters* was massive, but with innovation, artistry and hard work, our FX team created stunning visuals that supported the story.



***The Bad Guys 2* - DreamWorks Animation - Landon Gray, Michael Losure, Zachary Glynn, Chris Wombold, Olivier Malric**

The effects animation nominees of *The Bad Guys 2*—Landon Gray, Michael Losure, Zachary Glynn, Chris Wombold and Olivier Malric—represent a team of artists that created the unique Bad Guys 2.5D effects for the film. Several of these nominees are also recognized with nominations from the Visual Effects Society.



***Zootopia 2* - Walt Disney Animation Studios - Le Joyce Tong, Shamintha Kalamba Arachchi, Dimitre Berberov, Chris Carignan, Cristiana Covone**

Effects supervisor Le Joyce Tong, effects leads Shamintha Kalamba Arachchi, Dimitre Berberov and Chris Carignan, effects animator Cristiana Covone and the *Zootopia 2* effects department created character-driven effects that brought new worlds, species and visions to life. Creating the vision of a heat-sensing viper was essential for revealing the story's central mystery, while action scenes in snow and water required visual complexity, with layers of snowflakes embedded deeply into the characters' fur and a new toolset created to achieve believable fur-water interaction.

David Boyadjian is a professional film editor based in France with over 10 years of experience. His work spans scripted fiction, television and film trailers. He has collaborated on a wide range of television and film projects, including long-term creative relationships across formats. He is an Annie Award nominee for editing the animated series *Astérix & Obélix: The Big Fight*, following several years of collaboration with writer/director Alain Chabat and his teams.



***Common Side Effects, Episode: Raid* - Green Street Pictures, Bandera Entertainment, and Williams Street Productions - Tony Christopherson, Joie Lim**

Tony Christopherson is an editor and artist living in Los Angeles. He studied animation and filmmaking at the Minneapolis College of Art & Design. Throughout his career as an editor and animation compositor, he has worked on projects including *Cosmos: A Spacetime Odyssey*, *Atlanta*, ESPN's *30 for 30* and the critically acclaimed *Common Side Effects*. Joie Lim is an assistant editor based in Los Angeles. Originally from Seattle, Joie studied animation at the School of Visual Arts. Her most notable credits include the Emmy-nominated series *Scavengers Reign* and *Common Side Effects* as assistant editor.

Together, this team worked in close collaboration with the filmmakers and music teams to assemble a film that became a cultural phenomenon around the world.



Little Amélie or the Character of Rain - Maybe Movies, Ikki Films, Distributed by GKIDS - Ludovic Versace

Born in the suburbs of Lyon, Ludovic first practiced sports and martial arts before turning to animation. His graduation film *Golden Boy* marked the start of his career. Since then, he divides his time between animation work and community involvement. Passionate about the political power of cinematic imagery, he uses animation primarily as tools to address social and political realities. For *Little Amélie*, he collaborated closely with the co-directors and composer Mari Fukuhara to create a rhythm and emotion that seeks to best reflect the sensations of young Amélie as a child.



Olivia & las Nubes - Cine Chani, Historias de Bibi & Guasábara Cine - Tomás Pichardo Espaillat

Tomás Pichardo Espaillat (b. 1987) is a storyteller from the Dominican Republic, working primarily on animation, film and illustration. He was granted a full-year scholarship at Fabrice Benetton's Design Research Center, in Treviso, Italy, in 2013, where he worked on film and video. Tomás received his BFA in animation at Parsons, The New School of Design, in 2010, and his AA degree in fine arts at Altos de Chavón in 2008.



WINSOR MCCAY AWARD

RECOGNITION FOR CAREER CONTRIBUTIONS TO THE ART OF ANIMATION

The Winsor McCay Award, named for the most influential of character animation pioneers, was the first Annie Award established by Asifa-Hollywood and is awarded to a maximum of three individuals annually in recognition of lifetime or career contributions in direction, animation, design, writing, voice acting, sound and sound effects, technical expertise, music, education, or for other endeavours which exhibit an outstanding devotion to and promotion of excellence in the art of animation.



PHIL LORD AND CHRIS MILLER

Phil Lord and Chris Miller are the Academy Award-winning duo behind some of today's most successful and inventive films and series, including the *Spider-Verse* and *Lego Movie* franchises, *The Mitchells vs. The Machines*, *21 & 22 Jump Street*, *Cocaine Bear*, *Strays*, *Cloudy with a Chance of Meatballs*, *The Afterparty*, and *Clone High*.

Their next project is *Project Hail Mary*, the feature adaptation of Andy Weir's novel starring Ryan Gosling for MGM. Lord and Miller are directing and producing alongside Aditya Sood, Amy Pascal, Gosling, and Rachel O'Connor. The film opens March 20, 2026.

On the features side, the duo wrote and produced all three films of the *Spider-Verse* franchise: *Spider-Man: Into the Spider-Verse* (2018), which won the Academy Award, Golden Globe, and BAFTA for Best Animated Feature and over 20 critics' prizes; *Spider-Man: Across the Spider-Verse* (2023), which earned Academy Award, BAFTA, and Golden Globe nominations, seven Annie Awards, and a Critics Choice Award for Best Animated Feature, grossing over \$690 million worldwide; and the third film of the franchise, *Spider-Man: Beyond the Spider-Verse*, will be released in theaters on June 18, 2027.

Other films produced by Lord Miller include *Los Frikis* (Miami Film Festival 2024), *Cocaine Bear*, *Strays* (both 2023), and *The Mitchells vs. The Machines* (Netflix, 2021), which became the streamer's biggest animated film that year and earned an Academy Award nomination for Best Animated Feature.

The pair launched *The Lego Movie* franchise with their 2014 hit, which debuted at #1 and remained on top of the box office for four straight weeks as the year's fifth highest-grossing domestic release. They also directed *21 and 22 Jump Street* and wrote and directed *Cloudy with a Chance of Meatballs*.

In television, Lord and Miller were behind Apple TV+'s *The Afterparty* (2022-23), created, written, and directed by Miller, with Lord executive producing. They also produced the Max revival of their acclaimed animated series *Clone High*, which premiered its third season in February 2024. Lord Miller also produced the upcoming 2026 MGM+ and Prime Video series *Spider-Noir* starring Nicholas Cage.

The duo has multiple projects in development, including a Universal Pictures film inspired by the *Archie* comics, and multiple live-action and animated shows based on Sony's Marvel Characters.

RECOGNITION FOR CAREER CONTRIBUTIONS TO THE ART OF ANIMATION



MICHAEL DUDOK DE WIT

Michael Dudok de Wit was born in 1953, and after his education in the Netherlands, he studied etching in Geneva and animation at Farnham, England, where he made his first film, *The Interview*. After animating for a year in Barcelona, he settled in London in 1980. As a freelancer, he directed and animated many award-winning commercials for television and cinema, particularly for Richard Purdum Productions.

In 1992, he created his short *Tom Sweep* followed by *The Monk and the Fish*, which was created at the French studio Folimage. This film was nominated for an Oscar. His best-known short film, *Father and Daughter*, won the Grand Prix in Annecy and an Oscar. In 2004, he completed his short film *The Aroma of Tea*, and more recently, he wrote and directed the feature film *The Red Turtle* in France with Prima Linea Productions. *The Red Turtle* was a Wild Bunch - Studio Ghibli co-production. Michael is particularly grateful for the many inspiring conversations with Isao Takahata during the story development phase. *The Red Turtle* was nominated for an Oscar in 2017 and won the Special Prize at Un Certain Regard at the Cannes Film Festival 2016, as well as numerous other international awards.

Michael also illustrates books and gives masterclasses on animation, creativity and related subjects at art colleges and universities in the UK and abroad.



CHRIS SANDERS

Chris Sanders, the middle of three children from an artistic family, grew up drawing and writing short stories. "Art was the dominant thing in our house," he remembers. "On Friday nights, we all sat at the dining room table and painted as a family." Chris sketched throughout school and was the cartoonist for his high school newspaper, but he hadn't considered art as something he could do for a living. Then his grandmother read an article in the *Denver Post* about the California Institute of the Arts, and everything changed. After CalArts, Chris went to work for Marvel and then Disney, where he was a story artist on *Rescuers Down Under* and received writer/story and screenplay credits on *Beauty and the Beast*, *Aladdin*, *The Lion King* and *Mulan*. He would go on to write, storyboard and, with Dean DeBlois, co-direct, *Lilo & Stitch*, which earned Chris his first Oscar® nomination. (He also voiced and continues to voice Stitch.)

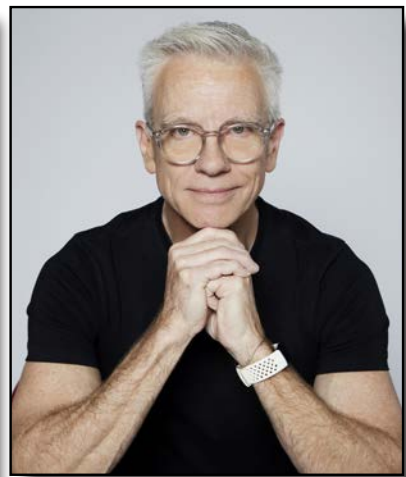
In 2006, Chris left Disney Studios to join the team at DreamWorks Animation, first as a character designer on the *Shrek* and *Madagascar* franchises, then on *Kung Fu Panda*, eventually jumping at the chance to direct *How to Train Your Dragon* with his *Lilo & Stitch* partner Dean DeBlois. Following the success of *How to Train Your Dragon* (Oscar®, BAFTA and Golden Globe nominations, Annie and Visual Effects Society Awards, etc.), Chris and Kirk DeMicco wrote and directed *The Croods* (yet more awards) establishing, along with *How to Train Your Dragon*, two hugely successful and enduring DreamWorks franchises.

Prior to writing and directing his most recent feature, *The Wild Robot*, Chris directed *The Call of the Wild* for 20th Century Studios, a live-action version of the classic Jack London novel, starring Harrison Ford. *The Wild Robot*'s powerful story about kindness and perseverance has earned even more recognition, including multiples of the awards Chris had already won and additional worldwide honors too numerous to mention. He has writing credits on the live-action remake of *Lilo and Stitch* and is currently developing *The Wild Robot* sequel.

Chris Sanders is a member of the Academy Motion Picture Arts & Sciences, ASIFA-Hollywood, and the Visual Effects Society. In addition to his four Academy Award® nominations, he has been recognized by ASIFA-Hollywood throughout his career, nominated for ten Annies and winning five...um...make that six, including this year's Winsor McCay Award!

VOICE ACTING IN AN ANIMATED TELEVISION/MEDIA PRODUCTION



***Bob's Burgers, Episode: Don't Worry Be Hoopy* – 20th Television Animation – Dan Mintz (Character: Tina Belcher)**

Originally from Anchorage, Alaska, Dan Mintz started his career doing standup in Boston, going on to write for shows such as *Nathan for You* and *Veep*. 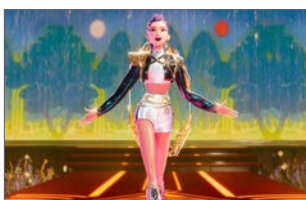
Elio - Pixar Animation Studios - Remy Edgerly (Character: Glordon)

#1 Happy Family USA, Episode 101: NINE TEN - Amazon MGM Studios, A24, Cairo Cowboy - Ramy Youssef, Pam Brady

From creator Ramy Youssef comes *#1 Happy Family USA*, an adult-animated series following the maniacally upbeat Husseins—the most patriotic, most peaceful and most definitely-not-suspicious Muslim family in post-9/11 “Amreeka.” With satire and absurdity, it redefines finding humor in hardship as they navigate the early 2000s under the watchful eyes of their terrified neighbors.



Adult Swim's *The Elephant*, Special Production - Titmouse and Williams Street - Pendleton Ward, Ian Jones-Quartey, Rebecca Sugar, Patrick McHale

Adult Swim's *The Elephant* is a rare creative experiment in which each of the three acts are made in isolation. With Sugar and Jones-Quartey working as a duo and McHale and Ward overseeing their own separate parts, the special is guided by “game masters” and *Adventure Time* alums Jack Pendarvis and Kent Osborne for a storytelling experiment that unfolds as a collaborative surprise, ultimately merging into a single, unexpected narrative.



***Common Side Effects*, Episode: Pilot - Green Street Pictures, Bandera Entertainment, and Williams Street Productions - Joe Bennett, Steve Hely**

Joe Bennett is the co-creator of *Common Side Effects* and 2024 Emmy-winning *Scavengers Reign*. He is a founding partner of animation studio Green Street Pictures. Steve Hely is the co-creator of *Common Side Effects*. He wrote for television shows including *Late Show with David Letterman*, *Veep*, *American Dad!*, *30 Rock* and *The Office*. He wrote three books, including *How I Became a Famous Novelist*, winner of the 2010 Thurber Prize for Humor.



***Lulu is a Rhinoceros*, Special Production - Bento Box and Propagate in association with Apple - Allison Flom**

Allison Flom is a storyteller and advocate from NYC. She's now adapting her award-winning podcast *Erased* for TV with Allison Williams and Propagate, writing *Fighting Time*, a series based on the bestselling book, and workshopping her new play. Allison leads weekly art groups in several women's prisons. She serves on the boards of Just Detention International and The Sunny Center, both supporting survivors of incarceration. Allison also co-chairs the Action Board at Getting Out Staying Out. Honored and astounded by this nomination, she is grateful beyond words for her dad, Jason Flom, whose inspiration, advocacy and relentlessness made this possible.



***Win Or Lose*, Episodes: 4, *Pickle* - Pixar Animation Studios - Carrie Hobson, Michael Yates**

Carrie Hobson and Michael Yates are the directors, writers and executive producers of *Win or Lose*. Hobson started as an intern at Pixar in 2012 and was hired full time in 2016 as a story artist—working on *Toy Story 4* and associate executive producing *Luca*. Yates joined Pixar in 2015 as a story artist and worked on *Soul*. Inspired by their individual paths and perspectives in life, the pair conceived of the overall concept for the multi-protagonist *Win or Lose*, taking Pixar in a fresh direction with its unique structure and characters.

Elio writers Julia Cho, Mark Hammer and Mike Jones tapped into Pixar's deeply collaborative process to build the story side-by-side with the studio's artists throughout production. The writers remained involved at nearly every stage as keepers of the film's story and character arcs. Maintaining a close partnership with the directors was crucial following *Elio*'s brain trust screening, requiring the writers to continually rethink and rewrite. Mark Hammer's (*Shotgun Wedding*) early script work provided a crucial foundation for Julia Cho (*Turning Red*) and Mike Jones (*Soul*, *Dream Productions*) to team up for the film's completion.



KPop Demon Hunters - Sony Pictures Animation for Netflix - Danya Jimenez, Hannah McMechan, Maggie Kang, Chris Appelhans

Originally from Anchorage, Alaska, Dan Mintz started his career doing standup in Boston, going on to write for shows such as *Nathan for You* and *Veep*. He is best known as the voice of Tina Belcher on *Bob's Burgers*, as well as T.V. on *Adventure Time* and has appeared on *Silicon Valley*, *The Goldbergs* and *Speechless*.



Little Amélie or the Character of Rain - Maybe Movies, Ikki Films, Distributed by GKIDS - Liane-Cho Han, Aude Py, Maïlys Vallade, Eddine Noël

Little Amélie is a collaboration between talented French artists and screenwriters with over 20 years of experience in the industry. Maïlys, director, story artist, animator and visual developer on many rewarded independent animated features; Liane-Cho Han, director and story artist on many animated features and renowned advertisements; Aude Py, Paris-based screenwriter and head of the writing department at La Fémis; Eddine, the talented production designer who worked on animated features like *The Little Prince* and *The Summit of the Gods*. Maïlys, Liane-Cho and Eddine have previously worked together on *Long Way North* and *Calamity Jane*.



Scarlet - Studio CHIZU - Mamoru Hosoda

Mamoru Hosoda began his career in animation in 1991 when he joined Toei Doga, now known as Toei Animation. Afterward, he transitioned to freelance work and directed the feature animations *The Girl Who Leapt Through Time* (2006) and *Summer Wars* (2009). In 2011, Hosoda co-founded Studio Chizu with producer Yuichiro Saito. He thereafter directed and wrote the screenplay for *Wolf Children* (2012) and *The Boy and the Beast* (2015). His work on *Mirai* (2018) garnered a nomination for the 91st Academy Award for best animated feature film. His film *Belle* (2021) was selected for the Cannes Premiere section at the 74th Cannes Film Festival.



Zootopia 2 - Walt Disney Animation Studios - Jared Bush

Zootopia 2 writer and director Jared Bush is also chief creative officer of Disney Animation and also co-director and co-writer of the original Academy Award-winning *Zootopia*. He was also executive producer and co-writer of the record-breaking hit *Moana 2*, as well as the screenwriter of the first *Moana*. He received an Oscar, Golden Globe and BAFTA award for *Encanto*, on which he was director (with Byron Howard) and co-writer (with Charise Castro Smith).

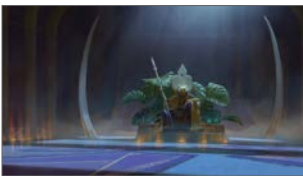

Alain Chabat is a French actor, screenwriter, director, producer and TV host. He rose to fame with comedy troupe Les Nuls on Canal+ before winning a César Award for best first film with *Didier*. He later directed the cult blockbuster *Asterix & Obelix: Mission Cleopatra*. In 2025, he earned the César Award for best supporting actor in Gilles Lellouche's *Beating Hearts (L'Amour ouf)*. Chabat recently created and directed Netflix's animated series *Asterix & Obelix: The Big Fight*, where he also voices Asterix. On TV, he is the creator and host of the hit shows *Burger Quiz* and *Le Late*.



***Eyes of Wakanda, Episode: Into The Lion's Den* - Marvel Studios**

Marvel Animation's *Eyes of Wakanda* follows the adventures of brave Wakandan warriors throughout history. In this globe-trotting adventure, the heroes must carry out dangerous missions to retrieve vibranium artifacts from the enemies of Wakanda. They are the Hatut Zeraze, and this is their story.



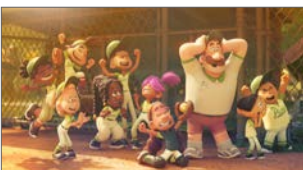
***Marvel Zombies, Episode: 2* - Marvel Studios**

Edgar Martins is a Portuguese, Emmy-winning storyboard artist and director with over two decades of experience in animation and visual storytelling. His credits include *Love, Death & Robots*, where he worked as a storyboard artist and story consultant, *Klaus* as head of story, and Guillermo del Toro's *Pinocchio* as a storyboard artist. He also directed the short *Poet Anderson: The Dreamwalker* with his twin brother Sergio Martins and continues developing original projects across animation and film.



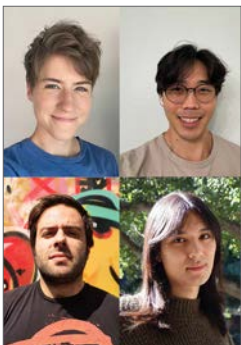
***ParaNorman: The Thrifting, Special Production* - LAIKA - Coleton Palmer, Katherine Jay Myong, Heewon Jeong**

***Snow Bear, Short Film* - The Art of Aaron Blaise, LLC - Aaron Blaise**

Aaron Blaise is a Winsor McCay Award winner. He spent 21 years with Walt Disney Feature Animation and worked as a supervising animator, character designer and director. In 2003 he was Academy Award-nominated for *Brother Bear*. He left Disney in 2010 to pursue other projects and recently completed his award-winning short film *Snow Bear*. The project took him three years to complete. He boarded and animated the entire project. In the end it was over 11,000 drawings. Aaron is also founder of CreatureArtTeacher.com, one of the world's leading online art education platforms.



***Tales of the Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtles, Episode: Rise of the Night Ninja* - Nickelodeon Animation Studios and Point Grey Pictures - Richard Chi, Matthew Kim, Sheldon Vella, Lyndsay Simpson**

Sheldon Vella is a 15-year storyboard artist, director and all-around animation try-hard. In debt to those who honor him with the title of "peer." Richard Chi: Although action/drama are his bread and butter, he prides himself on being able to make any sequence stand out with his meticulous storyboards. Lyndsay Simpson boarded a variety of genres in TV animation, and finds most of her creative joy in crafting authentic character moments, particularly for comedy/drama. Matthew Kim: From civil engineering to storyboarding, their work remains eclectic and inspired. Can work in a multitude of styles, their boards run the range of action/comedy/drama.



***Win Or Lose, Episodes: 8, Home* - Pixar Animation Studios - Esteban Bravo**

Esteban Bravo joined Pixar Animation Studios in 2021 as a story artist on *Win or Lose*. Following his time on the show, Bravo worked as a story artist on Pixar's latest original feature film *Elio*. As a story artist, Bravo visualizes and translates a series or film's script into hand-drawn storyboards. He works closely with the director and head of story to conceptualize story ideas, map out how a scene will be shot and define character performances. Prior to Pixar, Bravo worked as a story artist at Blue Sky Studios from 2017 until its closure in 2021.

He has illustrated for major press, musicians and luxury brands, notably collaborating with Hermès since 2019. His comic book *Préférence Système* won the Angoulême Critics' Prize in 2019. Through his company Remembers, co-founded with Felix de Givry, he has produced films, music videos, series and campaigns for major brands. His debut feature *Arco* premiered at Cannes 2025, winning multiple awards.



Elio - Pixar Animation Studios - Tony Rosenast

Tony Rosenast is a story artist at Pixar Animation Studios, where he has contributed to a wide range of feature films and shorts including Disney and Pixar's *Up*, *Cars 2*, *Cars 3*, *Inside Out*, *Sanjay's Super Team*, *The Good Dinosaur*, *Piper*, *Soul*, *Turning Red*, *Lightyear*, *Elio* and the 'Puppies' episode from the Disney+ series *Dug Days*. Additionally, Rosenast's story work includes uncredited contributions to *Coco*, *Onward*, *Luca* and *Elemental*. Rosenast joined Pixar in 2005, playing a key role in shaping story, character and emotional clarity across projects, collaborating closely with directors, writers and fellow artists throughout development and production.



Little Amélie or the Character of Rain - Maybe Movies, Ikki Films, Distributed by GKIDS - Nicolas Pawlowski

Nicolas Pawlowski is a French animation director and storyboard artist. He co-directed the short films *Fêlures* (2008) with Alexis Ducord and *Smart Monkey* (2014) with Vincent Paronnaud, both produced by Je Suis Bien Content. In 2017, he worked as a storyboard artist on *Zombillénium*, directed by Arthur de Pins and Alexis Ducord. He also contributed to *Les Hirondelles de Kaboul* (2018) as storyboarder and worked as head of the storyboard department for season 2 of the animated series *LastMan*. From 2022 to 2023, he worked on *Angelo dans la forêt mystérieuse* as storyboard artist and 2D character designer.



The Bad Guys 2 - DreamWorks Animation - Anthony Holden, Young Ki Yoon

Prior to his work on *The Bad Guys 2*, previous credits of Anthony Holden include *Puss in Boots: The Last Wish*, *Ruby Gillman: Teenage Kraken* and *Mr Peabody & Sherman*. Fuga Yamashiro joined Science Saru in 2016. He served as unit director on *Inu-Oh* and as an episode director on *The Heike Story*, as well as assistant director on *Keep Your Hands Off Eizouken!* and *The Tatami Time Machine Blues*. *Dan Da Dan* marks his directorial debut. Abel Góngora joined Science Saru and took part in many of director Masaaki Yuasa's projects. *Scott Pilgrim Takes Off* marked his first time directing a full series. Góngora storyboarded and directed the opening animation of *Dan Da Dan* and he serves as co-director on *Dan Da Dan: Season 2*.



***Not a Box, Episode: It's a Boat* – Silver Creek Falls Entertainment / Passion Pictures in association with Apple – Siri Melchior**

Siri Melchior is a designer, director, writer and illustrator with a focus on children's media. She has directed award-winning commercials, music videos, short films and TV series for kids, including the BAFTA-nominated *The Dog Who Was a Cat Inside* and two award-winning TV series based on her own illustrated books, *Rita and Crocodile* and *LILI*. She was part of founding two companies, Trunk Animation and Ladybird Films, but currently works as a director for Passion Pictures, London. Siri has also illustrated and written over 50 books in her native Denmark. *Not a Box* is Siri's first production with an American broadcaster..



***Tales of the Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtles, Episode: Rise of the Night Ninja* – Nickelodeon Animation Studios and Point Grey Pictures – JJ Conway, Kevin Molina-Ortiz**

Kevin Molina-Ortiz is a celebrated storyboard artist whose dynamic visual storytelling and bold creative voice have brought life to a wide range of media. With a flair for action, comedy and emotionally driven narratives, Kevin has lent his talents to major IPs including *Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtles*, *Transformers* and *Sonic the Hedgehog*. JJ Conway has been living his dream of working in TV/film for the past 15 years. 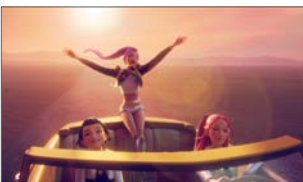

Maggie Kang and Chris Appelhans are the directors of the global hit *KPop Demon Hunters*, which began as an original idea from Kang and became fully realized through their partnership. Prior to joining Sony Animation, Seoul-born Kang contributed her talents as a story artist to projects from DreamWorks Animation, Illumination Entertainment and Warner Animation Group. Appelhans, an Idaho native, previously directed *Wish Dragon* at Sony Pictures Animation for Netflix, and has also been a part of several productions from Disney, Laika and Paramount.



Little Amélie or the Character of Rain - Maybe Movies, Ikki Films, Distributed by GKIDS - Maïlys Vallade, Liane-Cho Han

Maïlys Vallade and Liane-Cho Han, experienced animators with over 20 years in the industry, co-directed *Little Amélie*. Maïlys is a director, screenwriter, story artist, animator and visual developer for many highly awarded independent feature films such as *Ernest & Célestine* (Oscar-nominated) and *I Lost My Body* (Annie best animated feature). Liane-Cho Han is a French director, screenwriter, storyboarder and animation supervisor based in Denmark who has worked on high-end animated features like *The Illusionist* (Oscar-nominated). Together they collaborated on *The Little Prince* (César winner), *Long Way North* and *Calamity Jane* (both Annie-nominated films).



Scarlet - Studio CHIZU - Mamoru Hosoda

Mamoru Hosoda began his career in animation in 1991 when he joined Toei Doga, now known as Toei Animation. Afterward, he transitioned to freelance work and directed the feature animations *The Girl Who Leapt Through Time* (2006) and *Summer Wars* (2009). In 2011, Hosoda co-founded Studio Chizu with producer Yuichiro Saito. He thereafter directed and wrote the screenplay for *Wolf Children* (2012) and *The Boy and the Beast* (2015). His work on *Mirai* (2018) garnered a nomination for the 91st Academy Award for best animated feature film. His film *Belle* (2021) was selected for the Cannes Premiere section at the 74th Cannes Film Festival.

***Lost In Starlight* - Netflix / Climax Studios**

Lost In Starlight, set in 2050 Seoul, follows Nan-young, an astronaut dreaming of Mars, and Jay, a musician with a broken dream. They find each other among the stars, guided by their hopes and love for one another.



***Scarlet* - Studio CHIZU**

From visionary Academy Award-nominated filmmaker Mamoru Hosoda (*Mirai*) comes a powerful, time-bending animated adventure inspired by Hamlet, Shakespeare's classic tale of revenge and mortality. Scarlet, a sword-wielding princess from a war-torn medieval kingdom, sets out to avenge her father's death—but fails, awakening in a mysterious afterlife. There, she meets an idealistic young man from our present day whose compassion challenges her thirst for vengeance. 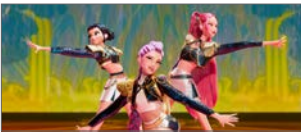

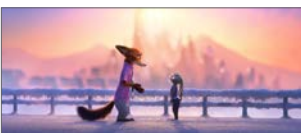
***Little Amélie or the Character of Rain* – Maybe Movies, Ikki Films, Distributed by GKIDS**

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THE ASIFA-HOLLYWOOD ANIMATION EDUCATORS FORUM

ASIFA-Hollywood's Animation Educators Forum is dedicated to the preservation and promotion of animation through education. Our international membership is focused on sharing its knowledge and experience throughout the animation education community. Thanks to the generous support of ASIFA-Hollywood, our volunteer organization can offer scholarship and grant opportunities, host discussions about current topics of interest, and feature student work in the online Student Animation Showcase.



Our Student Scholarship program supports students enrolled in accredited college animation programs around the world, enabling them to complete animation projects, purchase equipment, conduct research, and complete thesis projects. In 2025, the Scholarship Committee awarded a total of \$26,800 to six students from the United States, Canada, and Spain.

The AEF's Faculty Grant program provides financial support to individuals or groups in academic settings with research, scholarly, or creative animation projects. For 2025, the Faculty Grant Committee awarded ten grants totaling \$30,000. The selected proposals included:

- Production support for two animated shorts
- A study of experimental techniques, including real-time animation, artificial intelligence, interactive and 3D animation for big dome projection
- Support for a community college animation festival
- Assistance in the production of documentaries
- Funding for a podcast exploring how animation artists stay creatively motivated in their work and life

The AEF's Animation Salon is an ongoing series of informal Zoom presentations and discussions. Speakers range from past AEF Faculty Grant recipients to educational and industry professionals. In 2025 we held three Salons including a film screening, book launch and a talk about animation design.

The AEF and ASIFA-Hollywood presented the sixth **Student Animation Showcase**, celebrating the study and craft of animation by students from college-level animation programs worldwide. We are proud to continue to present this "first look" at the talent of these graduates as they begin their careers in the animation industry.
